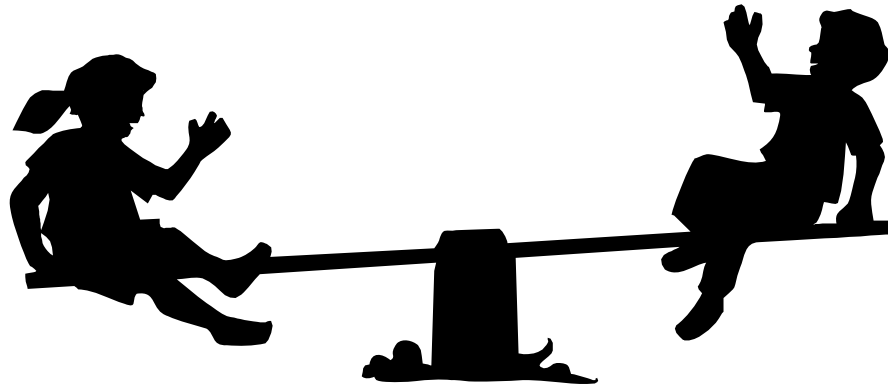

WHAT IS HEAD START?

Head Start is a federally funded, comprehensive child development program that mobilizes community resources to benefit low-income preschool children. Head Start originated under the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964. It is administered by the United States Department of Health and Human Services-Administration for Children and Families, Head Start Bureau. Head Start marked their 35th anniversary in the year 2000.

Ninety-percent of Head Start children are from families that live on or less than 100% of poverty level income or are receiving TANF (Temporary Assistance to Needy Families) Funds. The mandate to serve low-income children is based on the premise that these children can benefit from curiosity, self-discipline, and enhancement of their intellectual and physical development.

The goal of Head Start is to increase the competence of children and families to cope effectively with their environment, both in the present and in the future. To attain this goal, local Head Start programs provide a broad range of comprehensive services to the entire family. Four service areas are required in a Head Start Program. These include: Early Childhood Development/Health Services, Family/Community Partnerships, Program Design/Management and Disability Services. Local programs must design services that are relevant to and are reflective of the community needs, including cultural and ethnic backgrounds of the families.

Basic to Head Start is the philosophy that parents are the first and most important teachers of their children. A planned system of experiences to support and enhance this role is required in all aspects of the Program. Parents of currently enrolled children are involved in the decision-making process for the Head Start agency as members of the Parent Policy Council. Parents also work in the Program as paid employees and volunteers. Parent participation is considered a hallmark of the Head Start program.

Community involvement includes both formal and informal linkages with essential state and local services. Through family and community needs assessments, Head Start programs identify service needed and develop appropriate programs to best serve their community. Children are served in a variety of program settings including home-based and center-based classrooms.

Michigan Head Start Programs

The face of Michigan Head Start programs is growing and changing rapidly. Michigan has experienced tremendous expansion since 1988. Currently, Michigan's 37 Head Start grantees receive \$125 million to serve approximately 32,000 children and families.

MACOMB COUNTY COMMUNITY SERVICES AGENCY HEAD START

Head Start is funded by the US Department of Health and Human Services, sponsored by Macomb County Board of Commissioners and operated by the Macomb County Community Services Agency (MCCSA).

The challenge of MCCSA Head Start is to empower participants towards self-sufficiency and skill development thereby removing barriers, which limit the realization of individual potential.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Federally funded pre-school program for low-income families serving 3 and 4 year old children.
- Families must meet low-income guidelines to qualify.
- Families receiving public assistance automatically qualify.
- Most programs operate during the school year calendar with 4 classrooms running the entire year.
- Applications are taken on an on-going basis and openings are filled as they occur from a waiting list of eligible children.
- Selection of children to be enrolled is based on a priority rating that takes into account income, age, family size, parent status, foster care, special needs etc.
- Referrals are accepted from community agencies, schools, Health Department and Department of Consumer and Industry Services as well as Protective Services and are prioritized according to need.

Head Start Service Areas include Early Childhood Development/Health Services, Family/Community Partnerships, Program Design/Management and Disability Services.

EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT/HEALTH SERVICES provides a developmentally appropriate setting which encourages exploration and provides an Individual Education Plan for each child to insure that individual needs are met. Parents participate in curriculum planning and are involved in the classroom and implementation of their child's Individual Education Plan. Parents are provided opportunities to observe their child and participate in the classroom. Health Services insure that each parent has identified an HMO and has the resources necessary to have a health appraisal, dental exam, and up-to-date immunizations. Health screenings are conducted early in the year to insure that there are no physical conditions that would interfere with the learning process.

FAMILY/COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS engages families in a collaborative process through the development of a Family Partnership Agreement. This identifies family strengths and goals and provides the program with the opportunity to support parents in their efforts. Parents are an integral part of planning programs and training that are responsive to family interests and goals. Community Partnerships engage agencies, services and programs that impact on children and families to maximize their effectiveness and accessibility.

PROGRAM DESIGN/MANAGEMENT establishes and maintains a formal structure of shared governance through which parents can participate in policy making and other decisions. This service area is responsible for planning the total program, human resource management and the evaluation of services.

DISABILITIES/SPECIAL NEEDS addresses those children who have been identified or are at-risk of having special needs, handicapping conditions or disabilities. These needs can range from speech and language concerns to more severe impairments. The goal is to assist families in obtaining appropriate intervention as early as possible.

Head Start operates throughout the County and offers three-program options:

CENTER BASE

- 878 children are served in 46 classrooms in 22 Centers in 15 school districts.
- Children attend 4 hours per day, 4 days per week Monday-Thursday.
- Each classroom serves 18-20 children with 1 qualified teacher and 1 teacher aide.
- Transportation is provided for most children.

FULL DAY/FULL YEAR

- 120 children are enrolled in a full day, full year experience.
- Participation is limited to those children whose parent(s) are working or going to school.
- This option is provided in Mt. Clemens at Zion Church and at the Macomb County Child Care Center in Warren.

HOME BASE

- 24 children are served through the Home Base option in various areas of the county.

The goal of the Home Based option is to directly affect the role of the parent as their child's primary educator. This is accomplished through weekly home visits of 1.5 hours. During that time the teacher implements a learning activity utilizing materials found in the home that the teacher and the parent have planned the previous week. The teacher plays the role of coach to the parent providing a role model as well as direction and support. In addition to the home visits, children participate in two socialization experiences per month held in an existing Head Start Center. All services provided to Center Based children and families are available to the Home Based families in all services areas.

- Each Home Based teacher services 11 families.
- Eligibility determined following normal program procedures.

MICHIGAN SCHOOL READINESS PROGRAM (MSRP)

HISTORICAL OVERVIEW

In the 1983 publication entitled, *A Nation At Risk: The Imperative for Educational Reform*, preschool experience for children between three and five years of age was identified as a means for breaking the cycle of illiteracy, unemployability, and the lack of life skills needed to survive and prosper in today's world. In response to this, the (Michigan) State Board of Education adopted a *Blueprint for Action* in 1984, which recommended that local, and Intermediate School Districts establish and support the provision of early childhood programs for preschool children at risk of school failure.

In 1986, the State Board of Education approved a philosophy statement and *Standards of Quality and Curriculum Guidelines for Preschool Programs for Four Year Olds*, which articulated the conditions in which these programs should be developed, planned, implemented, evaluated and revised.

An appropriation of \$1 million was approved in FY 1985-86 and FY 1986-87 to support the operation of Preschool Pilot Projects. The three categories for grant models were (1) At Risk, (2) Collaborative, and (3) Teacher Training and Staff Development. The purpose of the three models was to ascertain effective systems, procedures and strategies for preschool programs.

CHRONOLOGY OF FUNDING INCREASES

Both the *State School Aid Act* and the *Department of Education Appropriation Act* provide funds for preschool programs. The 1987-88 State School Aid Act was amended to fund "preschool programs for four-year-old children at risk of becoming educationally disadvantaged and who may have extraordinary need of special assistance."

STATE SCHOOL AID ACT

An appropriation of \$2 million was approved in 1987 for district programs to begin operation after September 1, 1988. Per child allowance was \$400. An appropriation of \$12 million was approved in 1988-89 with a per capita allowance of \$1,600 to supplement the \$400 received in 1987-88 for a \$2,000 total per capita allowance. During 1988-89, 103 school districts participated in the Preschool Program serving 7,718 four year olds. Each year funding allocations were increased as follows:

Facts about the Michigan School Readiness Program (MSRP)

1. Children must be 4 on or before December 1.
2. First year programs must operate for a minimum of 20 weeks, 10 hours per week (2 1/2 hours/day for 4 days, or 5 hours/day for 2 days if Alternative Scheduled). In subsequent years, the program must operate for a minimum of 30 weeks. There is also an option for a home-based program.
3. Maximum class size is 16, with a 1:8 adult/child ratio.
4. Teachers must have a valid certificate with an Early Childhood Endorsement (ZA).
5. Paraprofessionals or Associate Teachers must have an Associate degree in early childhood/preschool education, child development, childcare, or Child Development Associate (CDA) credential or equivalent continuing education experience as approved by the State Board of Education.
6. Classrooms must be approved by the Michigan Department of Consumer and Industry Services, Division of Child Day Care Licensing.
7. Districts may subcontract their programs to Head Start or another licensed child care facility. The subcontractor must fulfill all the requirements of the program, but the certified teacher may have a Child Development Associate (CDA) credential instead of a ZA.
8. Community collaboration is required.
9. A district eligible to serve less than 18 children must form a consortium for fiscal purposes with other districts or an Intermediate School District. The districts can still run independent programs, or may join in their program operation as well.
10. Involvement by families of the children is required through home visits, parent/teacher conferences, family activities, and parent education programs.
11. Children and families become eligible for the program if they exhibit two of the 24 "risk" factors listed on the following page.
12. More than 50% of the children enrolled must meet an income criterion. The rest of the children can exhibit any two risk factors, and do not need to meet an income criterion.
13. Children may not be dually enrolled in another publicly funded preschool program (Head Start, Preprimary Impaired, Title I Preschool, or another Michigan School Readiness Program).
14. Children may be enrolled in a child care or private preschool program funded by the Family Independence Agency or parent tuition for the time they are not enrolled in the School Readiness Program.
15. The current allocation is \$3,300 per eligible child. (2003-2004)
16. Final allocation is determined by the numbers generated on the pre-application and the formula calculation. If need or capacity is less than the formula allocation, the allocation will be reduced accordingly.

FACTORS THAT PLACE CHILDREN "AT RISK"

The State Board of Education adopted a report *Children at Risk: Examination of Causes and Exploration of Alternatives* at its April 5, 1988 meeting. This report highlighted factors that place children "at risk" of becoming educationally disadvantaged and who may have extraordinary need of special assistance. This list is by no means exhaustive, but is offered to assist in defining, identifying and selecting eligible participants of the Michigan Department of Education, School Readiness Programs for four-year-olds. The list of risk factors includes:

1. LOW BIRTH WEIGHT
2. DEVELOPMENTALLY IMMATURE*
3. PHYSICAL AND/OR SEXUAL Abuses AND NEGLECT
4. NUTRITIONALLY DEFICIENT
5. LONG-TERM OR CHRONIC Illnesses
6. DIAGNOSED HANDICAPPING CONDITION (main streamed)
7. LACK OF STABLE SUPPORT SYSTEM OF RESIDENCE
8. DESTRUCTIVE OR VIOLENT TEMPERAMENT
9. SUBSTANCE ABUSE OR ADDICTION
10. LANGUAGE DEFICIENCY OR IMMATURITY
11. NON-ENGLISH OR LIMITED ENGLISH SPEAKING HOUSEHOLD
12. FAMILY HISTORY OF LOW SCHOOL ACHIEVEMENT OR DROPOUT
13. FAMILY HISTORY OF DELINQUENCY
14. FAMILY HISTORY OF DIAGNOSED FAMILY PROBLEMS
15. LOW PARENTAL/SIBLING EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT OR ILLITERACY
16. SINGLE PARENT
17. UNEMPLOYED PARENT/PARENTS
18. LOW FAMILY INCOME
19. FAMILY DENSITY
20. PARENTAL/SIBLING LOSS BY DEATH OR PARENTAL LOSS BY DIVORCE
21. TEENAGE PARENT
22. CHRONICALLY ILL PARENT/SIBLING (physical, mental or emotional)
23. INCARCERATED PARENT
24. HOUSING IN RURAL OR SEGREGATED AREA
25. OTHER (as identified by the applicant and presented to the State Board or Education to justify funding)

*This risk factor must be used in conjunction with another factor if a standardized test score is being used as the sole factor in meeting Risk Factor #2.
