



December has been a busy month for our students. They have spent a lot of time practicing for the holiday play and choir

"I liked it. It was a really good book. I would read it again." (Hatchet) –Conner


"I liked it." –Keegan

We want to say a BIG THANK YOU to all who have shopped with us and supported us.




