The ParaPro Assessment is a general aptitude test that is required in many states for paraprofessional certification. It also offers school districts an objective assessment of your foundation of knowledge and skills. The ParaPro Assessment measures the skills and knowledge in reading, writing, and math possessed by prospective and practicing paraprofessionals. It also measures their ability to apply those skills and knowledge when assisting in classroom instruction.

The reauthorization of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (Every Student Succeeds Act or ESSA), grants states the authority to determine the necessary qualifications for teachers and paraprofessionals working directly with students. Currently, Michigan requires paraprofessionals to **meet one of the following standards**:

- 1. Completion of two years of study or more at an institution of higher education (equal to 60 semester hours);
- 2. Obtain an associate's degree or higher;
- 3. Meet a rigorous standard of quality and demonstrate, through a formal state or local academic assessment:
 - a. Knowledge of, and the ability to assist in, instructing reading, writing, and mathematics;

or

- b. Knowledge of, and the ability to assist in, instructing reading readiness, writing readiness, and mathematics readiness, as appropriate.
- 4. The Michigan Board of Education has approved the following formal assessments by which a paraprofessional can demonstrate knowledge to meet standard #3, a and b:
 - a. *ETS ParaPro Assessment* with a passing score of 460. Both the paper/pencil test and Internet-based Test (IbT) versions of the ETS ParaPro have been approved. The IbT is only approved if administered by an Intermediate School District.
 - b. Michigan Test for Teacher Certification Basic Skills (MTTC)
 - c. *WorkKeys*® through June 1, 2017. After June 1, the WorkKeys will no longer be accepted due to changes within test content and elimination of the writing test.
