CALL TO ORDER

Superintendent DeVault reported that the Secondary Autism Program is celebrating Autism Awareness & Acceptance month by having spirit week this week and an assembly handing out lanyards, pencils, stickers, bracelets and goodies received from the United Champion School Grant.

Students will be attending a roller-skating party along with the students from Glen Peters on April 10th. The PTO has covered the cost of this trip for Bovenschen students. Bovenschen's Junior/Senior Prom will be held at Bovenschen on May 1st at 1:30 p.m. and the theme is starry night. Parents are welcome to attend to see the crowning of the King/Queen/Prince/Princess as vote on by the students/staff at Bovenschen.

The Wildcat Café classroom held a breakfast for a local Macomb business collation called "Built 4 Bizz". It is a 25-member group that meets once a week to discuss their business and create partnerships and share knowledge.

MDE LRE REVIEW

Justin Michalak, Assistant Superintendent of Special Education, reported on the upcoming MDE Site Visit. We are in year two of the Department of Special Education LRE monitoring where they monitor the ISD as a whole. During this audit they will do a student record review with 40 randomly picked students throughout the county. Information was pulled by each district and the ISD uploaded all the information to the state so that they could give their initial findings.

A total of eight people will be here the week of May 11th where they will present to us, take a tour around center programs in the county,

meet with the Parent Advisory Council, interview local districts and give a preliminary report.

BUDGET AMENDMENT

4. Assistant Superintendent of Business, Chris Frank and Accountant Shawn Freer gave an overview of projections for the 2026-2027 budget. While the districts including the ISD are waiting for final resolution, the House, Senate and Governor have submitted separate proposals each containing variable state and categorical recommendations.

Chris and Shawn also mentioned the number of projects that the district must continue to prepare for to allocate resources. Various programs were also reviewed that the local districts benefit from such as curriculum, instruction, training, technology, transportation and special education.

Moved by Schulte, supported by White, that this resolution shall be the general appropriations act of Macomb Intermediate School District for the fiscal year 2025-2026. An Act to make appropriations, to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations; and to provide for the disposition of all income received by Macomb Intermediate School District in compliance with P.A. 621. Ayes: all; nays: none. Motion carried.


ADJOURNMENT
