STATEWIDE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT DATA	Chief Academic Officer Alesia Flye reported that we have shared the data with our twenty one superintendents as well as the curriculum group. Our districts need to use the statewide data in planning. The data will take all our best thinking to improve student achievement. As Nell Duke has stated, "you can't intervene yourself out of low performance."
	When we look at current performance compared to 2023, Macomb has gone up in 11 of the 20 assessments. We are below statewide scores but we are above counties like Wayne and Genesee. We do however need to celebrate the bright spots. Some districts are implementing a math resource, some are doing literacy work that is really paying off, while others are working on attendance, utilizing high dosage tutoring and summer programs. The goal is all students should have tier one support and if not supported by research we should not be doing it.
