Educating our Future Teachers

At Anchor Bay High School, in the education courses, students can take three different courses. The courses include Child Development 1, Child Development 2, and Teacher Cadet. These three courses have the students studying

and learning childcare skills as well as all the facets of education and child care services.



In the

Child Development 1 course students study families, childcare styles, pregnancy, labor/delivery, and child care skills for the newborn infant through the first year of life. They participate in many real-life simulated activities such as creating a family tree, developing a budget for the 1st year of the infant's life, observing infant behaviors, and carinfant simulator baby. This simulation is a weekend long hands on experience that the students must feed, burp, diaper change, and rock the baby, all to provide around the clock care for 2 nights and 3 days.

Students who choose to move on will take the Child Development 2 course. Students study the young child from toddler age through early adolescences. Students study the physical, social, emotional, moral, and intellectual milestones of children in age groups from 2-12 years old, while also getting experience observing and working with children in these age groups. They will get the opportunity to work in volunteer childcare situations as well as observe behaviors of young children. Students also develop a babysitting tool kit and how to look for jobs in child care as a teen as well as investigate careers in childcare for the future.

The Teacher Cadet course is a full year 2-hour block class that has the students studying all facets of education and child care services through online research, observation, and a field experience.
